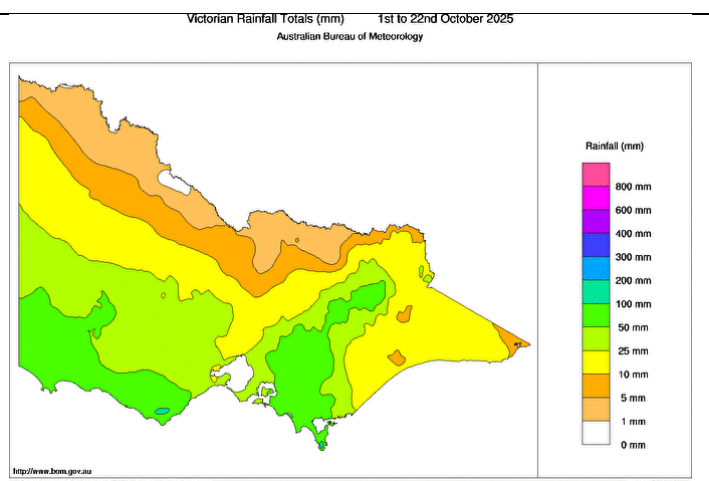


West Gippsland Rainfall Outlook – 23 October 2025

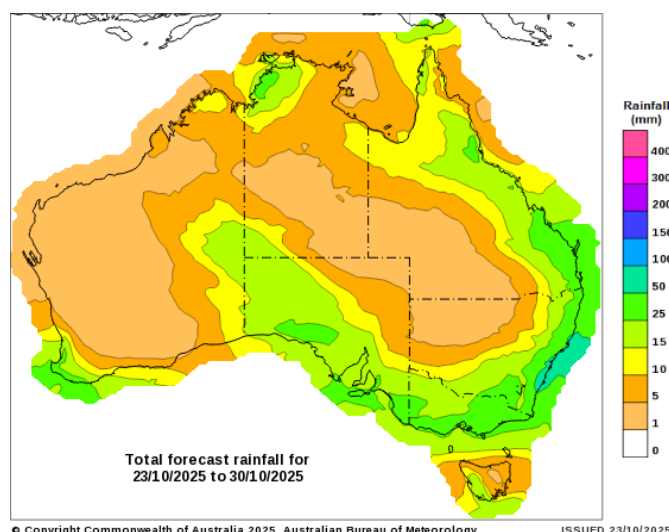
Past Rainfall

- So far this month, most of West Gippsland has received 50 – 100 mm of rain (see map at right).
- Most stations are tracking at about 50-70% of the monthly average, with a week to go in the month.
- Root zone soil moisture remains below average for the season over most of west Gippsland, grading to very much below average further east.

Outlook

- 25-50 mm of rain is forecast for West Gippsland over the eight days to 30 October 2025.
- There is about a 40% chance of above median rainfall (approx. 33 mm) for the following two weeks (October 27 to November 9).

- The November 2025 to January 2026 outlook for West Gippsland indicates a 55-60% chance that rainfall will exceed the historical median for the period.
- There are a wide range of possible rainfall outcomes, but model runs are slightly biased towards wetter than normal conditions.
- There is a 75% chance of at least 100 mm of rain over most of West Gippsland between November and January.
